<i>de Benito</i> and <i>El lacayo fingido</i> are not found elsewhere. <i>Los Jacintos</i> (<i>El zelofo de si mismo</i>) under the title, <i>Pastoral de Jacinto</i>, is to be found in part XVIII of his <i>Comedias</i>. Góngora's comedy, <i>Las firmezas de Isabela</i>, is also to be found in his <i>Obras</i> where a note states that it was completed by his brother, Don Juan de Argote. From the <i>aprovación</i>, which was dated at Madrid in 1612, it has been conjectured that an edition might have been issued in that year. The first listed edition is that of Córdoba, Francisco de Cea, 1613. T.-p., 4th <i>prelim. l.</i> ([†4]), and v^of269. The Hamilton Palace Library. Beckford Collection—Quaritch (with his bookplate: Bought at Sotheby's sale December 1882)—Archer M. Huntington (with bookplate) copy. This writer is, however, frequently at fault, and we need not of necessity believe that Le Gascon bound the present volume, notwithstanding the exquisite taste of the workmanship. It is not impossible that such was the case, but the style is rather that of Antoine Ruelle, and is better suited to this rare Spanish book than the florid ornamentation of Le Gascon.
